Research Analysis

The SAHB to HB2210 provides that if a minor is convicted as an adult for an offense they committed when they were under 18 and the courts finds clear and convincing evidence that the person against whom the minor was convicted of committing the offense trafficked the minor or sexually abused or assaulted the minor within 90 days before the commission of the offense, the court may do the following:

- Depart from the mandatory minimum sentence or sentence enhancement;
- Suspend any portion of any otherwise applicable sentence; or
- Transfer the minor to jurisdiction of the juvenile division for further proceedings.

The measure also defines *mandatory minimum*.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure would allow the courts to depart from certain sentencing requirements in cases where a minor has committed an offense against a person who has sexually abused or sexually assaulted the minor. In its current form, HB2210 is not anticipated to have an impact on state budget or appropriations.
