**Research Analysis**

HB 2326, as introduced, modifies the Oklahoma Security of Communications Act. The measure allows a person to intercept certain communication if the communication conveys threats of extortion, blackmail, and bodily harm, and if the person is party to the communication, or has received consent from one of the parties.

Further, the measure removes language allowing communication to be intercepted when only one party has given consent to the interception. The measure requires all parties involved to have consented to the interception.
