**Research Analysis**

HB 2419, as introduced, requires The Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules that require prescription labels and informational inserts be available in English and at least 14 other languages that are spoken in Oklahoma by individuals who are of limited English proficiency. The measure also requires that the Board update the list of other languages at a minimum rate of once every 10 years. The measure allows a pharmacy to contract with a third party for the translation of the labels and exempts a pharmacy from liability for injuries resulting from the actions of a third party.
