**Research Analysis**

The CS to HB 2477 authorizes offenders on administrative parole to receive earned credits. The offender is to earn 30 calendar days of credit for each month of compliance with the terms and conditions of probation. The measure allows persons on parole to receive 90 days of credit for hearing a high school diploma or GED; 120 days of credit for any college-level degree; and 60 days of credit for a vocational, technical, or career training certification or degree. Persons convicted of an offense which requires serving 85% of sentence or a domestic violence offense are excluded from obtaining credit.

**CHANGES MADE IN THE FLOOR SUBSTITUTE**

The amendment removes language relating to administrative parole and earned credit.

The amendment provides that when an inmate completes the term of active supervision, the Department of Corrections may terminate supervision of the inmate and place the inmate on inactive supervision.
