Research Analysis

The conference committee substitute for HB 2747 establishes the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Infrastructure Act, and creates Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination within the State Department of Health. The measure requires that the State Department of Health shall compile and publish an Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia State Plan and update the plan every four years. The measure requires that the State Plan include information on statewide coordination, progress reports, public policy recommendations, information on education, support, and other available services, and information on all grant awardees, projects, and amounts awarded under this measure.

The measure requires the Department to publish the state plan on its Internet website and shall submit the state plan to the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, the Governor, and the appropriate cabinet secretary.

The measure establishes two revolving funds in the State Treasury. The Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Research Fund, and the Dementia Caregiver Support Group and Education Program Development Fund. Both funds will be administered by the State Department of Health's Office of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Resource Coordination. The measure also requires the office to submit an annual report that details the Alzheimer's State Plan implementation progress, and the use and distribution of each fund.

Awards through each fund will be distributed by awards committees. The measure outlines the committee membership, and establishes a sunset for the fund of 5 years from the enactment.

The measure requires that the State Department of Health maintain at least one dementia-specific trained and certified community health worker, health educator, or other relevant employee in each health district to serve Oklahoma residents, and outlines the training guidelines and implementation of the requirement.

The measure repeals [Title 63, Section 1-879.2](#) relating to Alzheimer's Research Advisory Council – Duties.
