## **Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2749 creates a state employee information and promotion program through the Tourism and Recreation Department and stipulates procedures for the program.

Program procedures include:

- Full-time state employees, excluding State Legislators, who have been a state employee for at least one year are able to stay at any state-operated lodge or cabin at a discounted rate for two consecutive nights per year;
- State employees are to coordinate with facility managers for availability and approval; and
- State employees are responsible for all other expenses and to complete a questionnaire provided at the end of their stay.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

In Oklahoma, there are about 35,000 state employees that would qualify under this measure. According to the Oklahoma Department of Tourism and Recreation, the fiscal impact from this measure if expanded to all state employees would be around nine hundred fifty two thousand dollars (\$952,000.00). Below is a breakdown of estimated costs for all state employees and for different sized pilot programs. This cost estimate is based on a ten percent (10%) discount to all state employees.

Pilot Program 2	4000 employees	\$108,800.00
All Employees	35,000 employees	\$952,000.00
