**Research Analysis**

The PCS to HB 2852 creates the Bulk Fuel Transportation and Inspection Act. The measure requires every person wishing to transport bulk fuels by motor vehicle to possess and present for inspection, when requested by law enforcement, a proper bulk fuel manifest; allow for safety inspection by appropriate law and code enforcement officials during transportation; and only transport bulk fuel in visible, clearly marked fuel storage containers. Any person convicted of unlawful transportation of bulk fuels may be convicted of a felony, punishable by up to 5 years imprisonment, a fine of up to \$25,000, or both fine and imprisonment. The measure also creates the Fuel Pump Security Act which prohibits any person from opening, manipulating or altering a motor fuel dispenser for an unlawful purpose or to manufacture, possess or sell a motor fuel manipulation device intended to be used for an unlawful purpose. Violation is a felony punishable by up to 5 years in prison or a fine of not more than \$25,000 or both fine and imprisonment.
