Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 3000 allows fees collected pursuant to the Impaired Driver Accountability Program to be budgeted and expended by the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence for operating expenses. Any fees in excess of \$500,000 are to be deposited in the General Revenue Fund. The measure requires that pulmonologist certify medical exemptions from ignition interlock requirements. The Board is authorized to promulgate rules necessary to regulate ignition interlock devices and the providers of such devices and to charge appropriate fees for operations incidental to its duties. No licensed interlock provider utilizing a lease, clause, or contractual agreement that authorizes the provider impound, physically immobilize, or seize a vehicle may be licensed by the Board. The Board is authorized to prescribe and approve the requisite education and training for the performance of ignition interlock services and establish qualifications for individuals who provide ignition interlock services.
