Fiscal Analysis

The proposed subcommittee substitute to HB 3000 allows Impaired Driver Accountability Program (IDAP) fees to be collected by the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence up to Five Hundred Thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) each fiscal year. Any fee revenue collected in excess of this amount would be deposited in the General Revenue Fund. Previously, the Department of Public Safety (DPS) received Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of each fee collected by the Board from the administration of this program. Under this new structure, DPS would no longer receive this amount. Therefore, this measure would result in a decrease to DPS's budgetary resources. DPS estimates this decrease to range between Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) and One Hundred Thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) per fiscal year.

As the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence is a non-appropriated state agency, this measure would have no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state in reference to the Board specifically.
