Research Analysis

HB 3011, as introduced, modifies the Oklahoma Industrial Hemp Program in several ways. The measure:

- Defines the term "key participant," as someone with a direct or indirect financial interest
 in the hemp farm and requires that a criminal history of key participants be included in
 new or renewal license applications;
- Requires on-site remediation of noncompliant hemp;
- Requires that in order to sell hemp derivatives for livestock or pet feed, all parts of the plant must not exceed .3% concentration of THC; and
- Requires hemp harvest to occur within 30 days of sampling.
