**Research Analysis**

HB 3034, as introduced, requires schools to notify the parent or guardian of a student experiencing a possible allergic reaction and call 911 if Epinephrine is administered to a student. The measure also requires model policies developed by the State Board of Education to include mandatory annual training for employees on food allergies, recognizing anaphylaxis, and the proper way to administer Epinephrine.
