**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute to House Bill 3035 exempts the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (OMB) from needing to meet to determine the qualifications of applicants for certificates or licenses under the board's jurisdiction. The measure provides that the powers granted to OMB, including the authority to revoke, suspend, or impose disciplinary actions on the licenses of physicians or surgeons, also apply to those in inactive status. The measure also removes the requirement for the Executive Director to immediately suspend the license of any person who has defaulted from the Allied Professional Peer Assistance Program.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3035 allows peace officers hired by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (OMB) that are certified by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) the authority to inspect physician and surgeon personnel records to assess licensee compliance. In addition, this measure allows OMB the ability to revoke, suspend, and impose other disciplinary action to inactive physicians and surgeons.

OMB is a non-appropriated state agency, therefore any additional costs to regulate inactive physicians and surgeons are assumed to be objective within the Department's existing resources. As a result this measure has no direct impact on the state budget or appropriations.

The proposed committee substitute does not affect the fiscal impact of this measure, as it is provides clarifying language to when the Board can meet under the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
