**Research Analysis**

House Bill 3035, as introduced, provides that the powers granted to the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, including the authority to revoke, suspend, or impose disciplinary actions on the licenses of physicians or surgeons, also apply to those in an inactive status. The measure also removes the requirement for the Executive Director to immediately suspend the license of any person who has defaulted from the Allied Professional Peer Assistance Program.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3035 allows peace officers hired by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (OMB) that are certified by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) the authority to inspect physician and surgeon personnel records to assess licensee compliance. In addition, this measure allows OMB the ability to revoke, suspend, and impose other disciplinary action to inactive physicians and surgeons.

OMB is a non-appropriated state agency, therefore any additional costs to regulate inactive physicians and surgeons are assumed to be objective within the Department's existing resources. As a result this measure has no direct impact on the state budget or appropriations.
