**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 3105 makes numerous changes to provide the same protections found in law for motor vehicle dealers to powersports dealers.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The subcommittee recommendation to HB 3105 adds clarification around powersports dealers and allows powersports vehicle dealers to sell their products at off-premises events. A permit would be required for these dealers to sell at these events, with ten percent (10%) of all permit fees collected by the New Motor Vehicle Commission directed towards the General Revenue Fund. This measure may result in new permits being issued to powersports dealers, though the New Motor Vehicle Commission notes the additional amount directed to General Revenue as a result of these permits would be considered minimal.
