Research Analysis

HB 3191 allows a person age thirteen and one-half years old to operate a vehicle without a driver license if the person resides or is employed on a farm and is taking the driving skills examination when accompanied by a driver license examiner. The measure allows the written examination for a farm permit to be waived if the applicant has successfully completed driver education.

HB 3191 expands the age of those who are eligible to take driver education courses and allows Service Oklahoma to waive the written knowledge exam for residents applying for a farm permit upon verification of a successfully completed driver education course. Per Service Oklahoma, this measure would require an administrative cost of Forty-Eight Thousand, Five Hundred and Seventy-Six dollars (\$48,576.00) to implement these provisions.
