**Research Analysis**

House Bill 3235, as introduced, requires the Department of Human Services to develop and implement a universal electronic application for family support programs. These programs include:

- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Medicaid (SoonerCare)
- Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

The electronic application must be user-friendly, available in multiple languages, allow applicants to submit applications electronically, and facilitate secure data transmission among relevant agencies for eligibility and enrollment purposes. The agencies administering these programs are required to collaborate on protocols and systems for secure and efficient information sharing while maintaining privacy and confidentiality.
