**Research Analysis**

House Bill 3238, as introduced, establishes the Oklahoma Health Care Authority as the state administering agency responsible for administering Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) program agreements. The State Department of Health is tasked with licensing PACE organizations and conducting necessary monitoring. The measure specifies the powers and duties of the involved entities and authorizes the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board and the State Commissioner of Health to promulgate rules. Additionally, the legislation excludes PACE organizations from the definitions of adult daycare centers and home care agencies.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3238 exempts the Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) from home care licensure. After communication with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority and Department of Health, this measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
