Research Analysis

HB 3309 lowers the fee assessed against persons convicted of failure to yield and who causes a fatality or great bodily injury from \$1,000 to \$500 and requires that the fee be assessed and deposited in the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program Revolving Fund. Any person convicted of failure to yield and who causes a serious bodily injury may be assessed a fee of \$500 to be deposited in the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program Revolving Fund. In addition to the assessment of fees, the court may require the offender to participate in a remedial driving course, the loss of driving privileges for 90 days, or the payment of restitution of between \$3,000 to \$10,000.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure lowers from \$1,000 to \$500 a certain fee that is assessed and deposited into the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program Revolving Fund. Annual collections of this fee are as follows:

Based on the past 5 year's of annual collections, the average amount deposited into the fund is \$31 annually. The total amount of fees collected pursuant to the offense in this measure are already lower than the statutory amount to be assessed, and a reduction to that amount is expected to have a minimal impact on overall collections. Therefore, in its current form, HB3309 is not anticipated to have a material impact on state budget or appropriations.
