## **Research Analysis**

HB3325, as introduced, updates the voter eligibility criteria in state statute to match the voter criteria outlined in the state constitution. A qualified voter is someone who is a U.S. citizen, ages 18 or older and a state resident.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3325 clarifies in statute that only citizens of the United States may become registered voters. While this does not functionally change the current interpretation of the definition of a qualified elector in Oklahoma, there would be minimal costs associated with redesigning and updating voter registration applications and instructions. The State Election Board (SEB) estimates these costs to total less than Twenty Thousand dollars (\$20,000.00). It is expected that the SEB would absorb this cost within current budgetary resources.
