Research Analysis

HB3355, as introduced, exempts OMMA Certificate of Compliance holders from needing additional compliance certificates for renewal, provided the renewal application includes an affidavit confirming ongoing compliance with zoning, municipal ordinances, and safety codes.

Municipalities are authorized to establish inspection programs, and the Authority is required to create an affidavit form.

The measure further states that violations or false information will result in license suspension until compliance is restored.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3355 requires medical marijuana business licensees to submit an affidavit certifying compliance with applicable building codes instead of requiring a new Certificate of Occupancy.

The Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) is directed to create a standard affidavit form and oversee licensee compliance. OMMA intends to utilize existing staff to create the affidavit form and to review submitted application materials. As written, this measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the agency or state budget.
