Research Analysis

The floor amendment for HB 3571, named Odell's Law, removes the requirement that Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission (ABLE) license holders check IDs before serving alcohol, and allows them to retain discretion to verify IDs if they choose. The measure does not exempt license holders from the prohibition of serving alcohol to individuals under 21 years of age.

Fiscal Analysis

This bill creates statute that prohibits requirement for Alcoholic Beverage Law Enforcement Commission license holders to check for identification cards that verify age before serving alcohol. In its current form, HB3571 is not anticipated to have an impact on state budget or appropriations.

The FA1 provides the name "Odell's Law" to the measure and does not create fiscal impact.
