Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to House Bill 3591 requires that individuals over 18 years of age and who have been released from the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs receive an official or certified copy of their United States birth certificate, a Social Security card, information on how to obtain their medical records and health insurance, and a state-issued identification card or driver's license.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3591 requires that certain persons over the age of 18 shall receive an official or certified copy of their United States birth certificate, a Social Security card, information on how to obtain their medical records and health insurance, and a state-issued identification card or driver's license upon custodial release from the Oklahoma Office of Juvenile Affairs.

After further communication with Service Oklahoma, the measure does have a fiscal impact. According to recently obtained information, there were 497 individuals who were at least eighteen (18) years of age that could be impacted by the passage of HB3591. The current cost of a REAL ID Noncompliant state identification card is \$25.00 for a four-year credential. Assuming that these individuals would not otherwise obtain a credential, there is an estimated annual administrative cost of \$12,425.00.
