**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 3596 allows the extended duration of continued unemployment insurance claims to remain in effect until the end of the year. Employers are also required to disclose the name and Social Security number of a previous employee when filing an objection to that employee's unemployment benefits claim.

Additionally, the measure removes the requirement for documents to be hand-delivered to OESC when filed and repeals [40 O.S. Section 3-201](#), which refers to Employer for Any Part of Year Deemed Employer for Entire Year.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, HB3596 allows the extended duration of continued unemployment insurance claims to remain in effect until the end of the year. HB3596 also provides for certain process changes and repeals 40 O.S. Section 3-201.
