**Research Analysis**

The FA1 to HB 3613 adds a new paragraph 2 to provide that when an arrested person is held in custody subsequent to an arrest, an indictment or information must be filed by the State within ten days of the arrest, except if the tenth day is a weekend or holiday, in counties with a population of more than five hundred thousand.

**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure establishes a 5 day time limitation for the filing of an indictment or information after a persons arrest. In its current form, HB3613 is not anticipated to have an impact on state budget or appropriations.

The FA1 provides timeframe provisions for the State to file an indictment or information after certain arrests. It does not create fiscal impact.
