Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute for HB 3666 deems impersonation of a student with the intent to trespass on school grounds a misdemeanor. Upon conviction, an individual found guilty may face a fine of up to \$500 and imprisonment for up to 90 days.

Fiscal Analysis

This measure creates a new misdemeanor prohibiting false personation of students. Any person guilty of such offense shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 90 days, or both. Therefore, HB3666 may generate new revenue for the Administrative Office of the Courts, create costs for county jails, but such revenue and costs are not anticipated to require adjustment to the state budget or appropriation.
