**Research Analysis**

<p>The CS to HB 3729 modifies the expungement process by allowing for the automatic expungement of nonviolent misdemeanor criminal arrest records expunged. The measure provides that any person who was convicted of a nonviolent misdemeanor offense, at least ten years have passed since the date of conviction, the person has not been convicted of a felony, all fines, fees, and restitution if ordered by the court have been paid, and no felony or</p>
