Research Analysis

HB 3734 as introduced, requires a property owner wishing to lease their land for hunting to obtain a license from the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation. In order to obtain the license, the property owner must submit a signed lease agreement and the person wishing to hunt on the leased land must submit a valid Oklahoma hunting license and a photo ID. License fees are set at \$10 for Oklahoma residents and \$25 for nonresidents and are valid for the term of the lease or up to one year. Failure to obtain a license will result in a fine between \$200 and \$500 for residents or \$500 and \$1,000 for nonresidents or imprisonment for up to six months.
