Research Analysis

HB 3740, as introduced, requires ODOT to implement a third-party monitoring system to collect and analyze public comments during the public comment period of a project proposal. The measure provides that the third-party monitoring system must adhere to data protection and privacy laws as well as ethical standards and guidelines.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3740 requires the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) to implement a system for third-party monitoring of public comments received on projects that require a public notice and commend period. Per ODOT, the cost average for third-party monitoring ranges between Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) and Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) dollars. This range is dependent on the project type, scope, etc. As ODOT already uses a third-party monitoring service, it is expected that ODOT would absorb this cost within current budgetary resources.
