## **Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3747 allows the Oklahoma Veterans Commission to enter into contracts with private nursing facilities to provide services to Oklahoma Veterans who reside more than One Hundred (100) miles from a State Veterans Home. Furthermore, upon admission, if an Oklahoma Veteran resides more than One Hundred (100) miles from a State Veteran Home, the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs (ODVA) is directed to pay for a bed at a long-term care nursing facility within One Hundred (100) miles of the Oklahoma Veteran's residence.

ODVA estimated Two Thousand Six Hundred Forty-Four (2,644) veterans in the state of Oklahoma would qualify for long-term care and payment under this measure. ODVA used census data to determine the number of veterans not residing within One Hundred (100) miles of a State Veteran Home and are at least Sixty-Five (65) years old. Average cost for a semi-private nursing home bed in Oklahoma according to the AARP is approximately Five Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$5,550) per month or Sixty-Six Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$66,600) per year. Therefore, ODVA could be responsible for up to One Hundred Seventy-Six Million Ninety Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$176,090,400) per year to pay for long-term care in a private facility. According to ODVA, funding for this measure would require additional state appropriation in the full amount. Therefore, the fiscal impact on the state budget is \$176,090,400.
