**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure mandates the acceptance of cash as legal tender, tasking the Oklahoma Office of Attorney General (OAG) with enforcement and collection of fines. According to officials from the OAG, this would take substantial new resources for agents to perform compliance checks and issue citations. Other enforcement actions would include retailer checks, responding to complaints, and assigning one or more assistant attorney generals to allow retailers to appeal citations. The OAG estimates that it will need at least 2 attorneys and 6 agents at a total cost of \$1,200,000 for proper enforcement of HB3753, and the agency would seek additional funding to cover this cost.

The CS adds an exemption to the provisions of the bill and does not create fiscal impact.
