The committee substitute to HB 3763 allows county officials and fire departments to post burn ban signs on ODOT and OTA owned signposts. The locations of the burn ban signs are to be agreed upon by ODOT and the county or fire department. Installation, removal, and any associated costs are the responsibility of the county or fire department.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3763 provides that all fire departments or appropriate county officials shall be allowed to place "Burn Ban" signs on agreed-upon signposts controlled by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation or Oklahoma Turnpike Authority. This measure further provides that it shall be the responsibility of the entity placing the sign to post and remove signage in a timely manner. Installation, removal, and any associated costs are the responsibility of the county or fire department. In its current form, this measure does not mandate any action or expenditure by a state agency. Therefore, no direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations is anticipated.
