**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB3801 creates the seven-member Oklahoma Certified Meat Processing Facility Incentive Approval Board and establishes criteria for meat processing facilities to receive funds from the newly created Oklahoma Certified Meat Processing Facility Incentive Revolving Fund.

To qualify, the facility cannot have a foreign majority owner and must use at least 50% of inputs in the processing facility from an Oklahoma resident or business that is owned by a majority of equity interest owners from the state.

Violations against the foreign ownership or voting equity interest prohibition will result in a tax liability equal to the amount of incentive paid to the receiving entity. The State Auditor is authorized to examine the books of any entity receiving incentive payments in order to enforce the act.
