**Fiscal Analysis**

After communication with Service Oklahoma, the measure is anticipated to have a recurring administrative cost of \$96,775.00, and a one time implementation cost of \$32,384.00.

HB 3809 defines the term homeless person and would permit them to obtain a Real ID Noncompliant state identification card without costs, upon submission of necessary proof of temporary residence. According to the National Alliance to End Homelessness, there are 3,871 homeless people in Oklahoma. The current cost of a Real ID Noncompliant state identification card is \$25.00 for a four-year credential. The proposed committee substitute specifies that an applicant may obtain a four-year credential. Assuming that these individuals would not otherwise obtain a credential, there is an estimated annual cost of \$96,775.00.

The costs for implementation are estimated at \$32,384.00.
