**Research Analysis**

House Bill 3809, as introduced, provides that homeless individuals can request a certified copy of their birth certificate and a replacement REAL ID Compliant or Non-Compliant Identification Card without charge, provided they submit the request through a social worker or shelter coordinator where the person is temporarily residing. The request must be made on the shelter's or social worker's letterhead, including relevant identification numbers and an attestation of the person's homelessness. Only one free copy per person is allowed.

**Fiscal Analysis**

After communication with Service Oklahoma, this measure is anticipated to have a recurring administrative cost of \$145,162.00, and a one time implementation cost of \$32,384.00.

HB 3809 defines the term homeless person and would permit them to obtain a Real ID Noncompliant state identification card without costs, upon submission of necessary proof of temporary residence. According to the National Alliance to End Homelessness, there are 3,871 homeless people in Oklahoma. The current cost of a Real ID Noncompliant state identification card is \$25.00 for a four-year credential and \$50.00 for an eight-year credential. This bill does not specify whether the applicant could obtain a four-year or eight-year credential. Assuming that 50% of these individuals would choose to obtain an eight-year state identification card, there is an estimated administrative cost of \$96,775.00, and another \$48,388.00 for the four-year credential.

The costs for implementation are estimated at \$32,384.00.
