## **Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB4070 authorizes counties with a population of 100,000 or less to pass a resolution to form a county economic development organization (CODO) to implement economic development programs. Membership for the CODOs will determined by the county commissioners, who each have the power to appoint two members for a three year term. To fund a CODO, the county can levy a sales tax of up to .75 percent with voter approval.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB4070 clarifies language and authorized population size by specifying rural counties and populations of one hundred thousand (100,000) or less. Further, such counties may levy a sales tax of up to seventy-five hundredths of one percent (.75%).

In its current form, the measure authorizes local county government to implement a local county levy, and does not require administrative oversight by a state agency. The committee substitute does not alter the fiscal impact of the measure; therefore, no direct impact on the state budget or appropriations is anticipated.
