**Research Analysis**

SB 1000 allows the OSBI to inquire as to the condition and location of a sexual assault evidence kit that has not been submitted to a forensic laboratory within 20 days after receipt by a law enforcement agency. The OSBI may initiate an investigation on any previously untested or partially tested sexual assault evidence kit once testing has been completed.
