Research Analysis

SB 1572 requires the Construction Industries Board to register students with proper qualifications as apprentices rather than electrical interns. Apprentices must also be employed with a licensed electrical contractor and not apply more than 1,500 hours toward their journeyman requirements. An apprentice's registration expires on the last day of their school year.

Fiscal Analysis

In its current form, SB1572 requires the Construction Industries Board to register an eligible applicant that is employed with an active licensed electrical contractor as a student apprentice rather than a student electrical intern.

The measure stipulates that apprentices that apprentices must not apply more than 1,500 hours toward their journeyman requirements. The apprentice's registration expires on the last day of the school year.

This measure is not expected to impact state revenue or state appropriations.
