## **Research Analysis**

The conference committee substitute to Senate Bill 1675, extends the deadline for the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to implement provisions related to capitated contracts from October 1, 2023, to April 1, 2024. It mandates that all contracted entities complete the credentialing or recredentialing of a provider within 60 calendar days of receiving a completed application. Additionally, the measure changes the timeframe for a contracted entity to respond to a request for services for a hospitalized member from 1 business day to 24 hours, and it requires peer-to-peer conversations following an adverse determination to occur within 24 hours.

The measure imposes a 3% limit on the percentage of claims subject to post-payment audits and expands provisions regarding denied claims to include downgraded claims. It also extends the duration of the minimum reimbursement rates established by the Authority from July 1, 2026, to July 1, 2027. Furthermore, the measure stipulates that at least one capitated contract providing statewide coverage to Medicaid members must be awarded to a provider-owned entity that submitted a responsive proposal and demonstrated the ability to fulfill the contract requirements.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The CCR to SB 1675 modifies various provisions of the Ensuring Access to Medicaid Act, including certain requirements and obligations for contracted entities. In its current form, SB 1675 is not anticipated to have a direct impact on Medicaid costs; therefore, there are no fiscal considerations for the state.
