**Research Analysis**

Engrossed SB2029 renames the Director of Internal Affairs of the Oklahoma Tax Commission to the Director of Safety and Security and changes the qualifications, powers and duties for the position. The person who holds the director position will be a CLEET certified peace officer and may carry a firearm. The person will also be tasked with assisting with security of OTC facilities, but may not investigate violations of tax laws.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, SB2029 would require the Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) employee designated as a peace officer to be certified by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET).

This measure is not expected to impact revenues to the State. The OTC anticipates minimal administrative expenses associated with the cost of attaining or retaining CLEET certification.
