Bill Analysis

HB 2376 modifies the calculation used to determine years of service as it relates to longevity pay for state employees. The measure provides that any service performed by a person during which the person received compensation for duties performed for the state shall be counted if payment for such service was made using state fiscal resources. This new provision shall not apply to elected or appointed justices or judges, including special judges, who perform service in the trial or appellate courts. The measure also increases accumulation limits for employees who have worked for the state for 5- over 20 years from 60 to 80 days. Employees shall also be compensated a maximum of 640 hours of annual leave upon separation from state service. The measure also repeals a provision of law relating to noncompete contracts.
