**Bill Analysis**

SB 1285 directs the State Department of Education to establish and administer a grant program to award grants to school districts and charter schools to provide menstrual products to students at no cost. The measure directs the Department beginning with the 2024-2025 school year to annually allocate funds to reimburse districts and charter schools for the cost of menstrual products and dispensers. It requires grant recipients to make menstrual products available in easily accessible locations for students in grades five through twelve. The bill states that grants are contingent on availability of funding.
