**Bill Analysis**

SB 1364 requires the Council on Law Enforcement Education Training to provide 1 hour of education and training related to protecting the rights of residents of the state as enumerated in the Constitutions of the United States and the State of Oklahoma. The course shall cover the rights of freedom of religion, press, speech, assembly, petition, the keeping and bearing of arms, facing an accuser, trial by jury, being secure from illegal searches and seizures, right to life, liberty, the pursuit of happiness, and the enjoyment of the gains of their own industry. Officers shall receive training in their right to refuse to implement any order, mandate, or directive that they deem to be a violation of a person's rights. The measure prohibits any political subdivision from penalizing a law enforcement officer for his or her refusal to implement an unconstitutional order.
