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**Bill Analysis**

SB 1558 creates the Learn Everywhere Act, allowing students attending a public school district or public charter school to be eligible for extended learning opportunities outside of the traditional classroom. The measure allows a student to request credit for an extended learning opportunity, which may be granted by the school district or charter school or the State Board of Education. The measure requires each school district board of education and charter school governing body to adopt an extended learning opportunity policy. It allows students in grades nine through 12 beginning in the 2024-2025 school year to request credit for a course by demonstrating understanding of subject area content standards.

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
