**Bill Analysis**

SB 1724 authorizes the court to enter a written order requiring Service Oklahoma stay all actions that would deprive an offender of Class D driving privileges if the court determines the offender has no other means of transportation. The stay shall not be construed to give the offender driving privileges if he or she did not previously have a license. The measure requires the offender to provide proof of insurance to the court prior to the order being issued. The time period for the stay shall last until the offender has completed his or her community sentencing program. Upon completion of the program, the court shall determine whether it shall maintain jurisdiction over the offender's driving privileges for 1 year after the date on which the offender graduates from the program.
