**Bill Analysis**

SB 1780 requires notices of sale regarding public property that were subject to a partial taking to be posted by the Department of Transportation to also post such notice on its website. The measure also extends the period for the original owner of the property to purchase it again at the original price from 30 days to 90 days. For property that was subject to a total taking the Department shall notify the original owner by registered mail addressed to the last-known address of such person, firm, or corporation, with return receipt requested as well as on the Department's website. The offer of sale shall be in a similar manner as the sale of a partial taking to the original owner. Proceeds from the sale or rental of lands, or from the sale of equipment, materials, or supplies that are under the control of the Department of Transportation or Transportation Commission are to be deposited in the General Revenue Fund.

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
