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Bill Analysis

SB 1881 requires school districts and charter schools to disclose on their websites the procedures and processes to review or approve lesson plans, instructional materials, and activities; a listing of teacher and school employee training materials and activities; and instructional materials. The measure requires the disclosure to occur within 10 school days after the first use of each material, and it requires the information to remain on the website for at least two years. The bill clarifies that it does not require digital reproduction of materials or activities, disclosure of assessments, separate reporting of certain individual components of materials, posting or distribution of materials or activities that would constitute copyright infringement, or the listing of materials or activities used at a school site with fewer than 30 students or for individualized special education instruction. The bill allows a teacher or school employee to request that a district or charter school use the teacher's or employee's personal title and last initial instead of his or her full name when posting materials and activities.

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
