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**Bill Analysis**

SB 1940 prohibits payroll deductions of public employees for any purpose or organization other than to pay taxes, donations to charitable organizations, and fund savings, insurance, or other similar benefits. Payroll deductions currently authorized by law shall cease 1 month after the effective date. Any person found to have violated the provisions of this measure shall be subject to a civil penalty of \$100.00-\$1,000.00 for the first offense and \$500.00-\$5,000.00 for second and subsequent offenses. Persons aggrieved by a possible violation may seek abatement of the violation by petitioning a court of competent jurisdiction within 1 year from the date of the alleged violation for injunctive relief. Such persons may also bring an action to a court of competent jurisdiction within 1 year.

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
