PROPOSAL: <u>Amendatory</u>

SB 1244 proposes to amend the sales tax exemption for nonprofit organizations which provide services during the day to homeless persons [68 O.S. § 1356(54)] by removing the population threshold requirement that a nonprofit organization providing homeless day shelter services must be located in a metropolitan area with a population in excess of 500,000 persons.

EFFECTIVE DATE: November 1, 2024

REVENUE IMPACT: In Oklahoma, there are 32 cities and towns with a population of less than 500,000 persons that currently have homeless shelters. Presupposing these homeless shelters qualify for this exemption could result in a significant decrease in state sales tax collections.
