PROPOSAL: <u>Amendatory</u>

SB 2029 proposes to amend 68 O.S. § 105.1 to require the Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) employee designated as a peace officer to be certified by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET). The proposal would allow the designated employee to assist with security for the OTC and clarifies that the employee is not authorized to conduct investigations related to the violations of tax laws.

EFFECTIVE DATE: November 1, 2024

**REVENUE IMPACT:** SB 2029 does not impact tax revenues to the State.
