

1 Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of
2 Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) shall be used to provide
3 grant funding to providers for the one-time connection to the state-
4 designated entity for health information exchange.

5 SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Health
6 Care Authority in Enrolled House Bill No. 1004 of the 1st
7 Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of
8 Forty-seven Million Seven Hundred Sixty-seven Thousand Four Hundred
9 Fifty-eight Dollars (\$47,767,458.00) shall be used to increase
10 reimbursement to long-term care facilities by Thirty-five Dollars
11 (\$35.00) per day and reimbursement to intermediate care facilities
12 for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) by
13 Seventeen Dollars (\$17.00) per day.

14 SECTION 3. A. From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma
15 Health Care Authority in Enrolled House Bill No. 1004 of the 1st
16 Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of
17 Two Hundred Million Dollars (\$200,000,000.00) shall be used for one-
18 time funding to critical access hospitals and hospitals
19 participating in the Supplemental Hospital Offset Payment Program.

20 B. The Authority shall work in conjunction with an Oklahoma-
21 based association of hospitals to create the methodology for the
22 disbursement of this funding.

23 C. The Authority shall submit to the Senate Appropriations
24 Committee Chair and the House of Representatives Appropriations and

1 Budget Committee Chair a plan for the disbursement of the funds
2 listed in this section by no later than July 31st, 2023.

3 SECTION 4. A. The duties and compensation of employees, not
4 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
5 upon the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law shall be set by the
6 Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.

7 B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to:

8 1. Pay professional expenses of the Administrator of the
9 Authority including dues, licenses, professional memberships, and
10 continuing education classes conducted in this state; and

11 2. Pay professional expenses of any employee including dues,
12 licenses, professional memberships, continuing medical education
13 classes conducted in this state, and medical malpractice insurance
14 provided he or she is a full-time employee of the Authority in
15 accordance with subsection B of Section 5006 of Title 63 of the
16 Oklahoma Statutes and is utilizing those professional skills in the
17 performance of his or her job duties.

18 SECTION 5. In order to facilitate cash management of federal
19 grant receipts and disbursements, the Office of Management and
20 Enterprise Services shall transfer monies between the Oklahoma
21 Health Care Authority federal and revolving funds in amounts
22 requested by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.

23 SECTION 6. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to
24 transfer funds from Fund 205 and Fund 270 to Fund 200 and Fund 340

1 to satisfy claims made to the Authority under the Supplemental
2 Hospital Offset Payment Program Act.

3 SECTION 7. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care
4 Authority may request, in the manner provided in this section, that
5 receipt and expenditure of unanticipated federal funds awarded after
6 July 1, 2023, be exempt from expenditure limitations and from
7 budgetary limitations.

8 1. The Administrator shall make a request for exemption to the
9 Office of Management and Enterprise Services in writing and file a
10 revised budget program.

11 2. The Administrator shall also file copies of the request for
12 exemption and budget work program revisions with the Senate
13 Appropriations Committee Chair and the House of Representatives
14 Appropriations and Budget Committee Chair. The Senate
15 Appropriations Committee Chair and/or the House Appropriations and
16 Budget Committee Chair shall notify the Office of Management and
17 Enterprise Services of any noncompliance of the request with
18 legislative intent within twelve (12) calendar days of receipt of
19 the exemption request. The Office of Management and Enterprise
20 Services shall approve the request for exemption unless both the
21 Chair and Vice Chair of the Legislative Oversight Committee on State
22 Budget Performance provide written notification to the Office of
23 Management and Enterprise Services within twelve (12) calendar days
24 of the Committee's receipt of the exemption request that the

1 exemption subverts the intention and objectives of the Legislature
2 in establishing the original limit. The Office of Management and
3 Enterprise Services shall give written notice of approval or
4 disapproval of each exemption to the agency, the Governor, the Chair
5 of the Senate Appropriations Committee, and the Chair of the House
6 Appropriations and Budget Committee within eighteen (18) calendar
7 days of receiving the request.

8 SECTION 8. A. The Director of the Office of Management and
9 Enterprise Services shall transfer monies appropriated from the
10 General Revenue Fund and the Health Care Enhancement Fund to the
11 Oklahoma Health Care Authority disbursing funds in the amounts and
12 ratios requested by the Authority, except that the cumulative
13 amounts transferred shall not exceed the cumulative amounts of equal
14 monthly allotments of the appropriations from the General Revenue
15 Fund and Health Care Enhancement Fund.

16 B. Monies appropriated or collected for the fiscal year ending
17 June 30, 2024, may be transferred to these disbursing funds for the
18 fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, to satisfy encumbrances and
19 obligations of such fiscal year; provided, that monies equal in
20 amount are transferred from appropriations or collections for the
21 fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, to the disbursing fund for the
22 fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, to satisfy encumbrances and
23 obligations of such fiscal year. All transfer requests shall be in
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1 writing to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
2 Services.

3 C. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall maintain records of
4 the inter-year transfers.

5 SECTION 9. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care
6 Authority may request, through the Director of the Office of
7 Management and Enterprise Services, the early transfer by the
8 Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General Revenue
9 Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the agency's disbursing
10 funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

11 SECTION 10. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 1004
12 of the 1st Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature,
13 not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may
14 be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 (hereafter FY-
15 24), or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025
16 (hereafter FY-25). Funds budgeted for FY-24 may be encumbered only
17 through June 30, 2024, and must be expended by November 15, 2024.
18 Any funds remaining after November 15, 2024, and not budgeted for
19 FY-25, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then
20 current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-25 may be encumbered
21 only through June 30, 2025. Any funds remaining after November 15,
22 2025, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then
23 current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in
24 both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-24, and not

1 required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted
2 for FY-25, after the agency to which the funds have been
3 appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program
4 revision removing these funds from the FY-24 budget work program and
5 after such revision has been approved by the Office of Management
6 and Enterprise Services.
